TE PUKE / BAY OF PLENTY

- 20 minutes from Tauranga city (135,000 approx inhabitants), 40 minutes from Rotorua and lovely Mount Maunganui is only 15 minutes away
- Te Puke is a friendly semi-rural town of approximately 10,000 inhabitants

ACADEMIC STUDIES

At Te Puke High School we offer a comprehensive range of subjects to meet the needs of all students.

Our staff gather information about our new students from their previous schools. This helps us understand the needs of our new students, including their need for extension and/or extra support.

JUNIOR CURRICULUM

Our Year 9 and 10 students are provided with the opportunity to learn in a much more authentic, brain-friendly, integrated manner so that they can connect concepts. The structure of the curriculum shown on the following page is based on Themes, Options and Spins. All students have the opportunity to undertake extension work through inquiry to help them enhance their learning needs and interests.

THEMES

All Year 9 and 10 students study integrated Theme studies during the year, which incorporate the core subjects English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science and Physical Education/Health. Students are grouped in mixed ability classes for their integrated Theme studies.

OPTIONS

All Year 9 and 10 students select courses from the curriculum areas of Technology, The Arts and Languages. This helps to maintain a balanced curriculum for all junior students.

SPINS

Special Interest Subjects (Spins) cover all learning areas and include extension, interest and learning support options. Year 9 and 10 students choose their preferred Spins.

SENIOR CURRICULUM

YEAR 11

Year 11 students study seven subjects towards achieving NCEA Level 1 and/or NCEA Level 2. Compulsory subjects include English, Mathematics, Physical Education and Health, and Career Education.

YEAR 12

Year 12 students study six subjects towards achieving NCEA Level 1, 2 and/or 3. English is a compulsory subject.

YEAR 13

Year 13 students may study five, six or seven subjects towards achieving NCEA Level 1, 2 and/or 3.



LEARNING AT TPHS

Over the last 20 years MRI scanning has allowed scientists to develop a better understanding of what happens inside the brain when learning occurs. Added to this, educational research now gives teachers a much better understanding of how learning occurs.

From the research we know that quality learning occurs when it is:

- **Personalised**

Each person brings a different prior knowledge to the learning experience and learns new knowledge and skills in different ways. The way we learn is as unique as our fingerprint.

- **Socially Constructed**

When students work together through collaboration, peer-tutoring and reciprocal teaching this results in a deeper understanding of the material being covered.

- **Differentiated**

Each student comes into a learning activity with a different prior knowledge. This means they each require different levels of content, context, challenge and pace.

- **Student Initiated**

When a student initiates a learning experience or exploration, they learn more.

- **Connected**

When a student connects their learning to the real world in an authentic manner.

At Te Puke High School we are meeting this challenge by placing our students at the heart of our school. Within a supportive learning environment, our students are expected to take responsibility for their learning and achievement. Through this approach our students develop as confident, connected and competent 21st Century learners.

Te Puke High School is small enough to care and large enough to compete.

Te Puke High School aims to identify and support the needs of students who have exceptional ability compared to most students their age. Areas of exceptionality may include: Intellectual or academic ability, Creativity and Innovation, Visual and Performing Arts, Leadership, Cultural knowledge and ability and Physical or sporting ability. The Gifted and Talented programme supports students to fully realise their potential both in their area of exceptionality and as individuals.



MODERN LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

In recent years we have redeveloped our school into an innovative, modern learning environment, which is designed for our 21st Century learners.

Our modern learning environments have been designed to align three key principles. Firstly, how the brain works best. Secondly, how effective learning occurs, and thirdly, how effective teaching occurs.

Our innovative, modern learning environments are flexible, open and well-resourced to enable our students to engage in learning that is personalised, socially constructed, differentiated, student initiated and connected.

FLEXIBLE

Our classes can be split into smaller groups and spread over a wider area or combine with another class to allow team teaching or integrated learning areas.

OPEN

Our learning pods have fewer walls, more glass than traditional cellular classrooms. This provides the opportunity for teaching and learning to be deprivatised. Working in an open environment enables learning to be shared between teachers and learners.

WELL RESOURCED

Our students and teachers are provided with a range of learning spaces and electronic devices to enhance learning through a range of different learning activities, such as reading, group work, project space, wet areas, reflection, and presenting.

SPECIAL EDUCATION UNIT – TE RINGA AWHINA

Our Special Education Unit has been specifically designed to cater for our ORRS funded students who have intellectual and/or physical disabilities. Within a caring and supportive environment, students in our special education unit are provided with their own Individual Education Programme, which contains opportunities for inclusion in mainstream classes as much as possible.

MODERN TECHNOLOGY

At Te Puke High School we believe strongly that our 21st Century learners must have modern technology to help them engage in quality learning.

COMPUTERS

We have approximately 850 computers available for our students to use, including: desktop machines, laptops, netbooks, chromebooks, PCs, Macs and ipads.

Each teacher is provided with a laptop and appropriate support to improve their knowledge and skills to use modern technology.

DIGITAL CLASSROOMS

Our students and teachers are confident using Google Classroom as a collaborative platform for creating and distributing digital learning resources.

Our students use Google Sites as their e-portfolios to gather evidence of their learning and achievement.

SOFTWARE

Our students and staff are provided with up-to-date software programmes to meet their learning needs, including: Microsoft Office suite, Google Applications, Adobe Suite, Solidworks, 2D design, Archicad, Aspire, Audacity, Unreal Development Kit, GeoGebra, Lego Mindstorms, Lexia 5, Microsoft Movie Maker, Mixcraft, Python, Scratch, Sibelius, Sketchup and Cura.

DIGITAL MACHINERY

Our students use computers to design objects as technological solutions to real world problems. These objects are then created using appropriate computer controlled machinery; 3D printer, computer controlled laser cutting machine or a computer controlled router machine.

DRONE TECHNOLOGY

Through gaining their Drone Pilots' Licence, our junior students develop their understanding of applications for this type of modern technology. Our specialist drone pilots use the school's state-of-the-art drone with a 360 degree video camera, to provide a high quality professional drone videoing service for our school and community.

VIRTUAL REALITY

Our students are provided with the opportunity to learn using cutting-edge Virtual Reality hardware and software. Teachers provide quality learning opportunities for our students to use the software programme Unreal Engine to create their own programmes for Virtual Reality. Our students are working with our local business community to create Virtual Reality solutions to real-world problems.

A wide variety of co-curricular activities are offered throughout the year through the school and the community. However, the list varies each term - and year and times may vary. We will endeavour to assist our international students to get involved in activities of their choice, either at school or through the local community.

ACCOMMODATION SUPPORT

An experienced Homestay Manager provide support and guidance:

- Carefully selects friendly, active, warm and caring homestay families for international students who provide a real Kiwi experience.
- A wide range of homestay options are available including farm stays, orchards, families living in town or close to the beach.
- The Homestay Manager interviews and police vets all new homestay families and regularly meets with them and the student.
- All students are required to live in approved homestay accommodation. Our Homestay Manager checks and approves all our homestay families.

ESOL SUPPORT

- English language support is available to all international students
- These small classes cater for all levels of English
- Support and preparation for IELTS can be provided if required.

- Careers Advisors meet regularly with students to offer up to date information on careers and university pathways.

HOW TO ENROL

- The easiest way to enrol is online <http://tphs.enrol.school.nz>
- Apply to the school with a completed enrolment form and signed tuition contract. Include copies of your most recent school reports and a copy of your passport.
- If accepted, the student will be offered a place by letter which will show course commencement date, course duration, fees schedule and date by which the fees should be paid.
- Pay fees to the school.
- A receipt and offer of place is issued.
- The Homestay Manager will place the student with a suitable host family. Your host family will make contact with you before your arrival in New Zealand.
- It is compulsory for all international students to have comprehensive travel insurance. The school can assist with this.
- The school is notified of arrival times and will arrange to collect you at the airport.


NEW ZEALAND IMMIGRATION

New Zealand Immigration Service is responsible for the issue of all visas for travel to New Zealand. Full details of visa requirements, advice on rights to employment in New Zealand while studying, and reporting requirements are available through the New Zealand Immigration Service and can be viewed at www.immigration.govt.nz

INSURANCE

International Students must have current and comprehensive medical and travel insurance while studying in New Zealand. It is strongly recommended that the insurance covers the student's personal belongings. Te Puke High School is required to sight and approve all types of student insurance. An English translation of any overseas insurance policy is compulsory. Insurance can be arranged by Te Puke High School.





HOMESTAYS

Te Puke High School offers a wonderful range of homestays, some are near the school, others close to the beach and shopping mall or some on farms and kiwifruit orchards. We carefully match homestays with our international student profiles and all homestays provide:

- 3 meals a day, including lunch
- Warm, comfortable bedroom
- Welcoming, supportive and caring environment
- A real Kiwi experience

All homestays are selected carefully and are Police Vetted.
